In the second half the Jaguars played exceptional defense refusing to yield any more points while forcing a pair of fumbles. Joe Giles saved a touchdown by chasing down an MOT runner and tackling him on the 10 yard line. From that point the Jags defense stopped the MOT offense forcing them to turn the ball over on downs.
