Two of our teams, the 8-10's and 9-11's, have finished their season. We want to let them know how proud we are of each one of you and the improvement we saw each week.

9-11 Football

It was Homecoming Weekend and the Jaguars played host to Dundalk. Both teams scored early and often and found themselves deadlocked at 13-13 early in the second quarter. The Jags scored on a Kaiden Williams touchdown run of 30 yards and a Joe Giles run of 45 yards for a touchdown to answer Dundalk's touchdown runs of 50 yards and 42 yards. Dundalk broke the tie with a 20 yard touchdown run and a conversion to make the score 20-13, then scored again on a 60 yard run and added another 1 point conversion, Dundalk 27-Jaguars 13. With the Jaguars driving into Dundalk territory, Joey Juergens gained crucial first down yardage to the 10 yard line with 6 seconds remaining in the first half. On the next play Joe Giles took a handoff and on a halfback option play passed to Cody Schilling in the end zone. Kyle Fritz added a conversion point with a run into the end zone as the Jags closed the gap to 27-20 at the half.

Early in the 2nd half Dundalk picked off a Kaiden Williams pass and returned the interception 75 yards for a touchdown. Dundalk 33-Jaguars 20. Dundalk closed out the scoring with a 10 yard touchdown run in the 4th quarter. Final score Dundalk 39, Jaguars 20. On offense Joe Giles led all rushers with 52 yards. Kaiden Williams gained 35 yards on the ground and passed for another 81 yards. Dylan Jackson added 28 yards rushing and Joey Juergens 24 yards. On defense Joey Juergens had 5 tackles, Wyatt Griffith 4 tackles, and Joe Giles 4 tackles. Dalton Heitz had 4 tackles and added a quarterback sack.

After the game Coach Randy handed out Homecoming Weekend Awards. Best Offensive Player Award went to Kaiden Williams. The Best Defensive Player Award went to Joey Juergens and Best Lineman Award went to Wyatt Griffith.

The 9-11 Jaguars learned from some early season frustrations and gained confidence as the season progressed. The Jags played very competitive football for the second half of the season and should be proud of themselves. *We want congratulate them on their season.*
