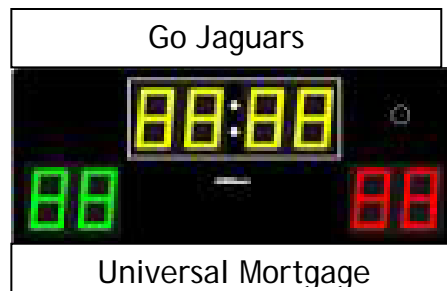


## 7-9 Jaguars

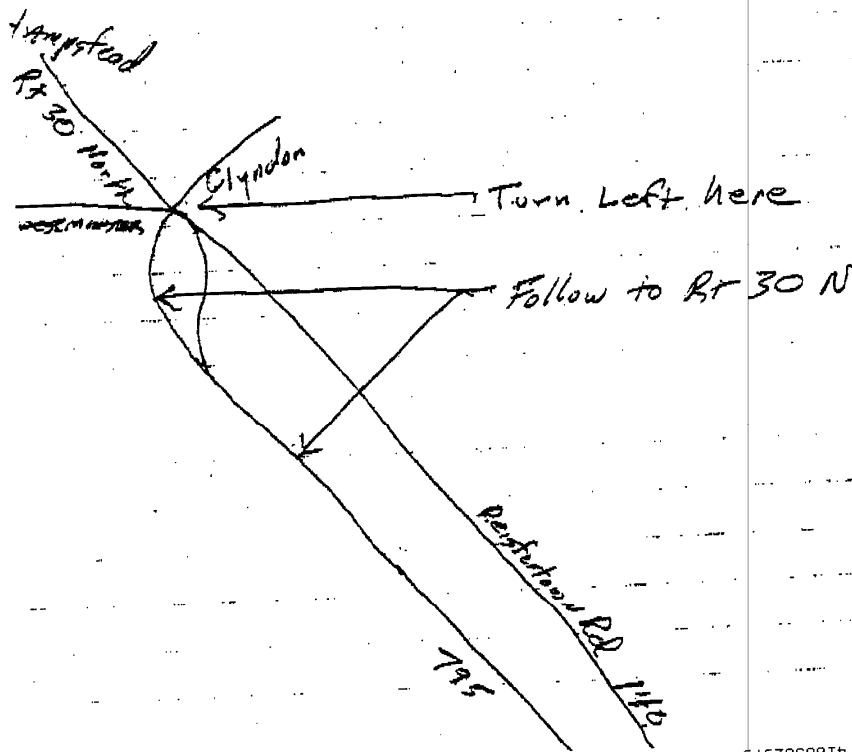
Installation of the new scoreboard should be complete prior to our 1<sup>st</sup> Home game.
